RUSSELL PERKINS (Argyle High School, Boys) led the 2020-2021 Eagles to a 31-1 record and the school's second State Championship. He is completing his 7th year as the head coach at Argyle with previous coaching stops at Abilene Wylie, Cameron Yoe, and Jim Ned High School. In his 28 years as a head coach, he has compiled an overall record of 712-215 with his teams appearing in 5 State Tournament and 10 Regional Tournaments in 26 playoff appearances.

Drew Coffman – Decatur

Lecture Title: *Building your Defense*

Drew Coffman is entering his first year at Eaton High School after concluding his nine seasons as Decatur's Boys Head Basketball Coach. Coffman has led the Eagles to 7 District Championships and Decatur's first ever State Tournament appearance in 2019. Before coaching at DHS, Coffman led successful programs at Hico and Kermit. Under Coffman's leadership, the Hico Tigers advanced to the Regional Tournament and had a school record of winning 35 games. While at Kermit, Drew Coffman led the Yellowjackets to their first outright district title in 12 years. Coffman currently has 329 career wins.

Coffman had a successful playing career at Texas Tech University and Midwestern State University. While at Texas Tech, Coffman was a reserve guard on two NCAA tournament teams. Coffman played for legendary coach Bob Knight. At Midwestern State, Coffman led the Mustangs to a Lonestar Conference Championship and an NCAA Tournament berth. Coffman was awarded First Team All-Lonestar and Daktronics First Team All-Region.

Coach Coffman's family includes his wife, Lana, who is an Elementary Principal in Decatur. He is blessed with three daughters Avery (16), Laken (13), and Maddyx (11). Coffman loves all sports, but is a huge fan of the Houston Astros, Dallas Cowboys, Los Angeles Lakers, and Texas Tech Red Raiders.



Andrea Robinson – Desoto

Lecture Title: *Coaching New Era Athletes: Adjusting to a New Generation*

Andrea Robinson- just completed her fifth year as head coach at DeSoto High School where she led them to the first 6A state championship ending in a 28-2 season (2020-2021). In 2018-19, the Lady Eagles finished 33-7 and advanced to the state finals finishing as UIL-state runner ups. Robinson previously served as head coach at Fort Worth Dunbar High School where she led them to two 4A state championships in 2004-05 and 2006-07. She also coached at Cedar Hill High School from 2008-09 to 2013-14 and led them to a 5A state semifinal finish in 2010. Then went on to Denton Guyer High school to lead them to a their first 6A district title in 2015-2016. Robinson has made a total of 6 UIL- state appearances at three different schools as a head coach with total of three state championships. Robinson has an overall record of 498-94 as a head coach.

Victor Schaeffer- UT

Lecture Title: *It's Not What We Do, But How We Do It*

Two-Time National Coach of the Year **Vic Schaefer** preps to enter his second season as the head coach of Texas Women's Basketball.

Schaefer, a Texas native who has spent 22 of his 36 years in coaching within the state of Texas and 28 years in the Southwest, is the fifth head coach in program history.

In 16 seasons as a collegiate head coach, which also includes seven seasons at Sam Houston State, Schaefer now owns a career record of 322-182 [.639]. Schaefer made quite an impression during his initial campaign on the Forty Acres by leading the Longhorns to 21 wins in 2020-21 as well as to the program's 10th all-time NCAA Elite Eight (first since 2016).

Before coming to Texas, Schaefer spent eight seasons as the head coach at Mississippi State (2011-20), where he led the Bulldogs to a 221-62 [.781] record and five NCAA Tournament berths, including two NCAA Championship Game appearances. Under his direction, Mississippi State won the program's first SEC regular-season championship and SEC Tournament championship and made five consecutive appearances in the SEC Tournament Championship Game, tying the University of Tennessee's record for consecutive tournament final appearances.

As a head or assistant coach, Schaefer has now been a part of one NCAA Championship, three NCAA Championship Games, four Final Fours, seven Elite Eight and 10 Sweet 16s.

As a player, Schaefer was an all-state performer in basketball, football, and baseball at Houston Lutheran High School before going on to play two seasons of collegiate basketball at Alvin Community College. He graduated from Texas A&M in 1984.

Schaefer and his wife, Holly, who played basketball at Arkansas State and later served as an assistant coach at UT Arlington, have twin children, Blair and Logan, both of whom graduated from Mississippi State during the 2017-18 year. Blair Schaefer currently serves as Texas' Director of Basketball Operations.

Paul Mills - Oral Roberts Univ.

Lecture Title: *Drills for Individual Development*

Paul Mills enters his 5th year as head coach at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, Ok. He has led the Golden Eagles to 2 post season opportunities during his 4 years including a Sweet 16 run in the 2021 NCAA Tournament. Paul served on staff at Baylor University for 14 seasons prior to taking over as head coach at ORU where he saw the Baylor Bears go from 1 conference win to a #1 national ranking in his final year in 2017. He served as a high school coach in Texas for 6 seasons before beginning his collegiate coaching career at Rice University in Houston.

He is married to Wendy Mills and the couple has 2 daughters, Audrey and Abbey. He has an undergraduate degree from Texas A&M and a graduate degree from Dallas Theological Seminary.



Terrence Johnson- Texas State

Lecture Title: *Dribble Drive*

Head coach Terrence “TJ” Johnson is entering his second season at the helm of the Texas State men’s basketball program and his seventh overall season with the Bobcats. In his first season, Johnson led Texas State to its first Sun Belt Conference regular-season championship and was named the 2021 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year as well as the 2021 NABC Division I District 23 Coach of the Year.

Johnson has worked with some standout players during his career, most notably Langston Galloway of the Detroit Pistons who played collegiately at St. Joseph’s. He went on to be selected by the New York Knicks and was named to the NBA All-Rookie Second Team for the 2014-15 season. During his coaching career, Johnson also conducted individual workouts and coached players like McDonald's All-American and current Cleveland Cavaliers Jarret Allen (Texas), Galen "G" Robinson (Houston) who plays for the Austin Spurs (NBA G-League), Alex Hobbs (Boise State), Jarrey Foster (SMU), and former Bobcats Nijal Pearson, who is the program’s all-time leading scorer.

Johnson, born in New Orleans, La., grew up in the close-knit community of Sebastopol, La. located in St. Bernard Parish. As the son of a basketball coach, Johnson was taught the fundamentals of basketball and instilled with the values of perseverance, dedication, and teamwork.

Cornelius Mitchell is entering his 5th season at Mansfield Legacy High School. He is recently coming off a 27 win season which is the most wins in school history where the broncos also finished ranked #7 in the state. Before accepting the position at Legacy Coach Mitchell spent 4 seasons in Houston at Aldine Davis High School where he started the basketball program. After 4 seasons his 2016 team won 30 games, which was also the most wins in school history. Coach Mitchell has also had coaching stops in Missouri, Iowa, as well as several

Texas. In the off season he spends time coaching with Nike on the EYBL circuit. His teams are consistent contenders in the prestigious Nike Peach Jam. This will be his 19th year coaching with 16 coming as a head coach.
